

**MINUTES OF THE CITY OF DRIGGS
SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING
September 24, 2013**

Pursuant to adjournment of the City Council meeting held September 17, 2013, and the call of the Mayor, the Driggs City Council met **Tuesday, September 24, 2013**, at 7:15 p.m. A roll call was taken and present were council members: Greer Jones, Ralph Mossman, George Mosher, and Colin Dye, Public Works Director Jared Gunderson, and City Clerk Kreslyn Schuehler. Council President Mosher led the Pledge of Allegiance.

SHOSHONI PLAINS PARK BIDS – HARMONY DESIGN

Randy Blough, from Harmony Engineering, presented a revised plan for the Shoshoni Plains Park. He met with Jason Calderwood, from Trail Creek Nursery, on site and asked him to verify the bid numbers. Mr. Blough stated Mr. Calderwood did acknowledge that some prices were lower, but stated he wanted to obtain the job.

Mr. Blough stated he eliminated the trees on the north end and by the pathway with a reduction in the bid of \$5,600, bringing the total bid to under \$50,000 as requested.

Discussion of the alternate options began. The Council agreed to discuss this further at the next meeting.

Council Member Mossman made a motion to approve the bid from Trail Creek Nursery for the Shoshoni Plains Park as amended. Council Member Dye seconded the motion. The motion passed with all in favor.

Council Member Mossman made a motion to approve the work order #11 from Harmony Design for the survey for the 300K gallon tank property. Council Member Jones seconded the motion. The motion passed with all in favor.

WORK ORDER FOR WATER TANK VALVE REPLACEMENT – AQUA ENGINEERING

Jared Gunderson presented the work order for the million gallon tank valve replacement project which totaled \$76,600. He stated DEQ did not have any funds at this time and would require a study to be completed before which would cost an additional \$30,000.

Council Member Jones made a motion to approve the work order #12 as presented.

Council Member Mossman questioned how involving both Harmony and Aqua Engineering would save the city money. Council Member Mosher stated that it was Harmony Design’s duty to “double check and administer the project.”

Council Member Mossman seconded the above motion. The motion passed with all in favor.

DISCUSSIONS

Mr. Gunderson explained the future work orders that would be submitted regarding the WWTP.

Mr. Gunderson stated the radar portable speed devices could not be purchased with resort tax funds according to Mayor Powers. Council Member Mosher disagreed and it was determined to further discuss the issue at the next meeting.

ADJOURNMENT

Council Member Dye made a motion to adjourn. Council Member Jones seconded the above motion. The motion passed with all in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 8:06pm.
